ITEM VII: CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

- Autumn Chambers, 109 W. Broadway, and Rose McLaughlin, 111 Broadway, shared their concerns with noise levels and activities at Charley's Roadhouse which is located behind their homes; shared concerns about bar patrons congregating outside of the building, offensive events occurring in the backlot, urination on residential property; multiple complaints have been filed with the Police Department; concerns were brought to the Board of Aldermen's attention in May of 2016 and problems have persisted; would like a resolution to the noise level first and foremost; a petition from neighbors who also have concerns was provided for the record
- Mayor Todd asked Chief Starbuck for the volume of calls; calls have been numerous and citations have been given

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- Alderman Totton asked how long residents have lived in the area and if they knew the bar was operating when they moved in; length of residency varied and although the bar was known, additional concerns have occurred since moving in
- Mr. Arroyo noted that multiple code violations are in progress; additions to the building have been non-permitted and are in process for General Ordinance Summons; Charley’s Roadhouse has two pending Disturbing the Peace Charges; additional calls will be added to the case file
- Mr. Hunt asked the Board to consider what decisions need to be made between the citations and the police calls; when granted a 3AM license it was agreed upon that no activity would occur outside of the building
- Mayor Todd has been on the phone with Ms. Chambers and could hear the noise level and music through the phone
- Mr. Geary advised that the citations needed to go through the court process and violations of liquor license permits should go through the Board of Aldermen
- Ms. Chambers asked if there was a specific noise ordinance; Disturbing the Peace is the option the City has; Conditional Use Permits with noise restrictions only apply to special zoning areas
- Members of the board discussed convening to review the continued violations and whether or not a Public Hearing should occur for Revocation of License; Mr. Geary would like time to review the Ordinances and advise on future proceedings
- Chief Starbuck noted that last year the owner was cited for Disturbing the Peace but the case was dismissed
- Chief Starbuck and Captain Beale met with the owner and night manager last week and laid out expectations; Mayor Todd asked if the Board would prefer to wait and see if things improve since the meeting with the police occurred or if the Board would like to meet with the owner(s); Alderman Bamman would like a hearing to listen to both sides regarding the action as the complaints are clear
- Mr. Hunt will bring an executive summary with violations to the April 9th Board of Aldermen meeting and at that time, a decision on the next course of action can be made; Alderman Headley would like to see the Building Code violations included in the summary

ITEM XII: PUBLIC HEARING

-Mayor Todd Opened the Public Hearing for the zoning change of city owned property at 7:30p.m.-

- Mr. Murphy asked the Board to refer to the aerial photo provided of the property in discussion; the property is 16 acres north of Tisha Lane and is currently zoned Agricultural; request is to change zoning to R1 Single family which mirrors land around the area; North side of the property cannot be built on as it is a streamline restoration site; it was planned for this to be developed in the early 2000's but with the economic downturn this was not completed; city currently owns the land and felt R1 single family would be the best use
- Mayor Todd shared, in the order of transparency, that he owns a lot that backs up to the property
- Alderman Totton shared her conversation with a resident unhappy with the homes being built; Mr. Murphy spoke to the same resident who was under the impression that the field would remain undeveloped; Mr. Murphy shared the various options for the lots with the resident and how it was decided that residential lots would be the best option for those already residing in the area

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Mayor Todd opened the floor to citizens for comment:

- Jeff Bell, 608 SW Lakeview Drive, questioned if this would be single family homes only; shared concerns about duplexes being built in the past; the entire 16 acres will be for single family homes and duplexes are not allowed in this zoning

-Mayor Todd Closed the Public Hearing for the zoning change of city owned property at 7:35 p.m.-

- Alderman Bamman asked for clarification on aerial drawing provided; clarification was given
- Alderman Arnold shared that this was brought to Planning and Zoning committee and one gentlemen shared concerns; Alderman Arnold shared alternative options discussed and how it makes most sense for the community to build more homes which are in high demand
- Alderman Totton asked the value of the homes which will be built; minimum square footage is 1,500 square foot and all will have basements

 - Property in this ordinance was the property discussed in the public hearing held this evening
 - Alderman Totton asked how close these homes will be to the houses that are already there; minimum space required is 30 feet from property line to the back of the house; rules will be the same as the rest of the city
 - Alderman Headley asked when paperwork would be available; bids have been received and will be discussed

 - Mr. Arroyo shared since 2005 the city has partnered with Utility Services to do maintenance including inspections; interior and exterior paint; replacing screens, filters, valves, etc.; agreement ensures DNR requirements are met in order to maintain a safe water system

 - Asked Chief Starbuck to provide an update on the purchase of a radar trailer
 - Radar speed trailers run from \$6,000-\$8,000; signs which are commonly attached to a light pole run from \$2,500-\$3,200
 - Chief Starbuck shared that other cities have a program where citizens are trained as volunteers to run radar and take a reading only-if vehicle is over 10 mph license plate numbers are taken down and some departments will send warning notice; Chief Starbuck would like to research more about the program-several agencies are doing it but would like to learn more about potential liabilities or downsides to the program; shared concerns about potential for confrontations when citizens aren't aware of the program
 - Alderman Coleman asked if the radar trailer or radar signs are preferred; trailer units can be moved but are easily damaged; signs have a shorter battery life

 - Asked Chief to provide rules for businesses participating in neighborhood watch program; Chief will see if there are guidelines to follow
 - Thanked people of her neighborhood as well as the Grain Valley School District baseball team who helped with cans

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- Alderman Chris Bamman
 - Candidate Forum is tomorrow evening
 - Next school Board meeting is on April 12th and Jared English will be sworn in
 - General Election will have a bond issue for an expansion to the high school
- Alderman Jeff Coleman
 - Asked staff to look into pothole in front of Papa Murphy’s Pizza; staff have already been in contact with MODOT and are asking MODOT to consider concrete instead of asphalt

ITEM XVIII: MAYOR REPORT

- Discussed possibility of adding a crosswalk signal on Main Street with increase in business
 - It is easier to add crosswalk at Walnut and Main as the railroad isn’t a factor
 - Mr. Arroyo shared approval from MODOT can take several months
 - Mayor Todd estimated this would cost approximately \$29,000
 - Alderman Totton shared concerns about traffic on Front Street; Alderman Arnold asked if any negative issues would come from not providing both crossings (Front and Walnut); Alderman Headley asked if it was required with the parking lot by Front Street; crosswalk is currently present but without a signal, cars are not stopping; makes most sense to have crossing at Front street but the process with the railroad needs to be determined
 - Mr. Arroyo will begin the process with both MODOT and the railroad and see what options are available
- Citizens have asked about a crosswalk at Armstrong Park, crossing over Buckner Tarsney; discussion occurred about signage pointing community members to the current crosswalk closer to 40 HWY; Alderman Coleman didn’t think signage would help; Mayor Todd would like to make an attempt to direct people to the crosswalk
