Resolution No. R19-27: A Resolution by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri Approving a Three (3) Year Cooperative Agreement Between the City and the Grain Valley Partnership

 - Partnership is now in its fourth year as the Economic Development Corporation (EDC); this is the first renewal of the contract with the EDC; initially they were offered a 3 year agreement of \$35,000 per year; Central Jackson County Fire Protection District and the Grain Valley School District are also committed; this agreement has expired and moving forward the new cooperative agreement has been reduced to \$25,000 in part due to recruitment of new business being handled within City Hall
 - Alderman West asked if the EDC would be given a 1099 Miscellaneous if they are considered an independent contractor; in the past there was no documentation required from the Grain Valley School District, Central Jackson County Fire Protection District or the City in the form of a 1099; Alderman West would like this to be reviewed to make sure the City is in compliance
 - Alderman West asked if payment amount is limited; Board of Aldermen could increase this if desired but \$25,000 is the minimum payment; any additional payment would come before the Board of Aldermen for approval and a budget amendment

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI APPOINTING MEMBERS, FILLING VACANCIES, AND REESTABLISHING THE TERMS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2012, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, adopted Ordinance No. 2211 authorizing the formation of the Industrial Development Authority of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri (“IDA”); and

WHEREAS, the members of the Board of Directors of the IDA (“Directors”) are required by Chapter 349 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (the “Industrial Development Corporations Act”) to be resident taxpayers of the City of Grain Valley and may not be an officer or employee of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Directors are required by the Industrial Development Corporations Act to serve staggered terms that are initially two years, four years, and six years in duration; and

WHEREAS, while it is not clearly stated in the language of the statute, it appears the intent of the staggered terms requirement in the Industrial Development Corporations Act is that successive terms of Directors all be six years in duration in order to maintain the staggered terms initially set for the Directors; and

WHEREAS, over the past seven years the terms of the Directors have become disorganized; and

WHEREAS, Director Penny Kruse is no longer a resident taxpayer of Grain Valley; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2016, Director Jeff Coleman was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Grain Valley Board of Alderman; and

WHEREAS, some of the individual Directors’ terms have expired which has created hold-overs in office; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen desires to fill those vacancies; appoint successors, and reestablish the terms of the individual Directors to six-year, staggered terms.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

SECTION 1: Appointment and Reappointment of Directors. The following persons, having been duly appointed by the Mayor pursuant to the Industrial Development Corporations Act, and who are duly qualified electors of and taxpayers in the City of Grain Valley, Missouri,

and who have been resident taxpayers of the City for at least one year immediately prior to their appointment, and who are not officers or employees of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, are hereby given the advice and consent of the Board of Aldermen to serve and are appointed and confirmed (and reappointed and reaffirmed as applicable) as the directors of the IDA, each such person to serve for a term, or remainder of an existing six-year term, as set forth opposite his or her name below and until his or her successor is duly appointed and has commenced his or her term of office.
