WHEREAS, the City has requested funding from County's Anti-Crime Sales Tax Funds to assist the City in defraying certain costs of its Law Enforcement School Based Initiatives (LESBI) or similar anti-drug; and anti-violence programs and,

WHEREAS, the County's Jackson County Drug Commission recommended and the County Legislature approved the City's request as an appropriate expenditure of Anti-Crime Sales Tax Funds; and,

WHEREAS, this Agreement provides a suitable mechanism by which the designated County funds shall be disbursed to the City;

NOW THEREFORE it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. The County agrees to pay to the City a total amount not to exceed \$82,534.00. Upon execution of this agreement, Organization may submit an invoice documenting costs incurred dating back to January 1, 2022. Prior to September 30, 2022, and upon receipt and approval of the previous LESBI Semester Report, the final payment shall be made. This award is contingent upon collection of sales taxes as budgeted at the time of the contract award. If COMBAT funds are reduced, contractor will be informed of necessary contract revisions, as provided for in this Agreement. City agrees to submit semester program reports on forms provided by COMBAT Administration. All payments will be processed within 30 days of receipt of invoice, if the invoice is complete and accurate. All payments will be detained until the semester program reports are received and accurate. Any reports that are incorrect will delay payment.
- 2. The County agrees and acknowledges that the City shall use the proceeds of this Agreement, together with City funds and any federal or state grant funds which may have been awarded, to cover certain expenses of its LESBI or similar anti-drug and anti-violence programs, all as is more fully set out in the funding request and other documents attached hereto as Exhibit A, Program Budget Page attached hereto.
- 3. The City agrees that all proceeds of this Agreement shall be subject to audit by the County's Legislative Auditor or such other auditor as the County may designate. Additionally, the City agrees to contract for the performance of a

comprehensive audit in conformance with the Single Audit Act of 1984, and to forward two copies of the audit report to the Jackson County COMBAT Commission, one of which will be forwarded to the County's Department of Finance and Purchasing.

- 4. The City shall provide an annual program report at the end of each calendar year summarizing all activities of its LESBI or similar anti-drug and anti-violence programs to the Jackson County COMBAT Commission containing such particulars as said Commission might specify.
- 5. Section 9304 of the Jackson County Code states "Any proceeds from the Anti-Drug Sales Tax creating jobs and employment shall have a twenty percent goal for minority hiring and employment." Organization shall use its best efforts to meet this goal.
- 6. City agrees that evaluative outcomes shall be given priority status. COMBAT Administration will monitor City to assure that not only are the terms of this Agreement being fulfilled, but also to monitor the treatment program's impact on drug use. City agrees to participate in an effectiveness evaluation of the City's program objectives and an overall evaluation of specific core items, as required by COMBAT Administration. City further agrees to utilize an agency specific evaluation document. City agrees to participate in and respond to periodic COMBAT Administration evaluations, assessments, and data inquiries. The COMBAT Administration will evaluate City performance periodically based on the City's semester performance reports and compliance with contractual provisions. The County reserves the right to terminate this Agreement pursuant to paragraph 12 if the City does not meet stated performance measures and contractual requirements. COMBAT will conduct unannounced site visits to any and all agencies.
- 7. If the City receives or obtains any media attention because of this project, the City is required to acknowledge that funding for the project is from COMBAT funds. Printed material involving this program shall contain the COMBAT logo and a COMBAT sign shall be posted at the program site(s) for the duration of the contract.
- 8. This Agreement shall be effective as of January 1, 2022, and extend through December 31, 2022, for expenses incurred during the same time period.
- 9. To the extent allowed by law, the City shall indemnify, defend, and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the City or its employees, agents, or representatives.

- 10. The City warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 11. Pursuant to §285.530.1, RSMo, City assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an undocumented immigrants to perform work within the State of Missouri and/or Jackson County, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, City shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B, affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.
- 12. This Agreement may be terminated for any reason or no reason by either of the parties upon thirty (30) days written notice to the party's designated fiscal representative. All services and payments shall continue through the effective date of termination. Termination of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the rights or obligations which the County or the City may be entitled to receive as provided in this Agreement, or be obligated to perform under this Agreement for services prior to the date of termination. Should this Agreement terminate, all County written materials of any kind must be delivered and returned by the City to the County within ten (10) days of the termination of this Agreement.

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION

Substance-impaired drivers contributed to 22.0 percent of Missouri's traffic crash fatalities during the past five years. Alcohol remains the primary contributor to substance-impaired driving crashes; however, the number of persons under the influence of prescription medications and/or illicit drugs continues to increase. Male drivers were more likely than females to be involved in substance-impaired driving crashes. During the past five years, males were responsible for 80.2 percent of substance-impaired driving fatalities. Nine percent of the children less than 15 years of age, who were killed in motor vehicle crashes over the last five years, were riding with a substance-impaired driver who often was an underage-impaired driver.

Grain Valley is located in eastern Jackson County Missouri along Interstate 70 with additional access via US 40 Highway, State Route AA and State Route BB Highways. It is approximately 20 miles east of Kansas City with a population of 15,627 (per the 2020 Census) in roughly 6 square miles. Considered to be a residential community, there has been an increase in businesses locating to Grain Valley. Currently, Grain Valley has one bar with a 3:00 am license and seven 1:30 am licenses for the pubs, restaurants and movie theatre.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash statistics, there were 411 crashes in Grain Valley between 2018 and the end of 2020. Of those crashes, 19 were alcohol or drug related resulting in 6 people injured and 13 crashes resulting in property damage. During this same time frame, 73 DWI arrests were made through routine patrol and grant funded enforcement.

Department statistics show that most DWI arrests occur between midnight and 4:00 am. Highway Patrol statistics show that drinking involved crashes begin increasing at 7:00 pm and stop at 4:00 am. A large number of crashes occur during the 9:00 pm hour and then again from 11:00 pm through 4:00 am. Our officers will make the most impact working shifts between 9:00 pm and 3:00 am or from 10:00 pm through 4:00 am.

GOALS/OBJECTIVES

Core Performance Measure Goals

1. Based on a goal of 0 fatalities by 2030, Missouri is projecting a five-year average target of 222.8 alcohol-impaired driving involved fatalities by December 31, 2022.

To provide additional officers on patrol during the time when impaired driving is the highest in order to decrease the number of alcohol and/or drug related accidents within the city limits of Grain Valley.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Two officers will be assigned to conduct extra patrol city wide with emphasis on US 40 Highway and State Routes AA and BB during the designated MoDOT quarterly DWI Campaigns. These are the main roads that lead in and out of Grain Valley.

Each quarterly enforcement will run for 6 hours either from 9:00 pm to 3:00 am or from 10:00 pm to 4:00 am on Friday/Saturday or Saturday/Sunday. Reports show that these days and times have the highest incidence of arrests for impaired driving. This puts officers out on the road when residents are either returning from their night out or bar patrons are leaving other establishments outside of Grain Valley to take advantage of our bar that is still open.

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION

Speed and aggressive driving can be any one of us, when we make the choice to drive over the speed limit; change lanes several times in a short distance and/or follow too closely. Aggressive driving is a costly decision, often made in an instant, but can have lifelong consequences. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, aggressive driving is when an individual commits a combination of moving traffic offenses so as to endanger other persons or property. During the last five years (2015-2019), the combination of aggressive driving behaviors contributed to 53 percent of fatalities and 44 percent of serious injuries in Missouri. Speed-related conditions, including exceeding the speed limit and too fast for conditions, accounted for the most fatalities of all aggressive driving behaviors. Thirty-six percent of all Missouri fatalities over the last five years were speed related.

Grain Valley is located in eastern Jackson County Missouri along Interstate 70 with additional access via US 40 Highway, State Route AA and State Route BB Highways. It is approximately 20 miles east of Kansas City with a population of 15,627 residents within roughly 6 square miles. Considered to be a residential community, there has been an increase in businesses locating to Grain Valley.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash statistics, there were 411 crashes in Grain Valley between 2018 and the end of 2020. Of those crashes, 65 were injury crashes with 80 people reporting minor injuries and luckily only 7 reporting disabling injury. No fatalities were reported during this reporting period. High crash days were Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday with the highest number of crashes occurring from 2:00 pm through 6:00 pm. There was also a spike in crash occurrences during the morning commute from 7:00 am through 9:00 am.

Contributing factors include the following: Failed to Yield - 16% Distracted / Inattentive Driving - 15% Following Too Close - 7% Too Fast for Conditions - 5% Speed - Exceeding Limit - 5% Vision Obstructed - 4.8%

- · Programs (number and success of programs held compared to planned programs, evaluations if available)
- · Training (actual vs. anticipated enrollment, student evaluations of the class, student test scores on course examinations, location of classes, class cancellation information)

The current tire skid steer in the Public Works department is now 25 years old with over 3,000 hours on it. Every time it goes in the field it comes back needing repair due to the age of the machine. The main use is road repair and maintenance, and the pavement grinder will not work on it due to not having the correct hydraulics and electrical plug in connector.

New machines were tested from Bobcat, Caterpillar, and Kubota. John Deere was contacted and could not provide a machine for testing and withdrew. After testing and discussion the Kubota was identified as the best replacement for current and future use.

This new tire skid steer will be primarily used for road maintenance and repair operations, keeping the tracked skid steer off of road use, and extended the life of the tracks and undercarriage.

The old tire skid steer will be sold via Purple Wave auctions.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this request is to gain final plat approval for this phase of Eagle Ridge Multi-Family 3rd Plat.






