

Thank you for participating in the Community Competitiveness Assessment program. This document will serve as the summary of our findings and observations based on our visit on August 22-23, 2016.

Purpose and Scope of Community Competitiveness Assessment

The Community Competitiveness Assessment is a program offered by The Missouri Partnership to interested rural communities in the state. Now in its fourth year, it is designed to give communities comprehensive feedback on how their community presents itself to a hypothetical company that is looking to relocate to the area. Ady Advantage was selected as the provider of this service for 2016.

The assessment included a number of assessment tools, including a self-reported Capacity Readiness Assessment, the completion of a mock RFI, a review of existing economic development website and marketing materials, and then an evaluation of the community's best sites and buildings. During our on-site visit, we also assess the site visit itself, interview local employers and are given a windshield tour of the community, which provides us with information on the community's key economic assets and weaknesses.

This document represents the comprehensive reporting back to you about our observations and recommendations for your community.

Overview of the Site Selection Process

During the community presentation, I shared an overview of the site selection process. (A copy of this presentation can be found in **Appendix A**.) The key findings from this presentation are summarized below; these three categories also serve as the organizing framework for my evaluation of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri in the next section.

- The site selection process is one of elimination, which has a couple of related implications. (COMPETITIVE POSITIONING)
 - Having a website presence is very important as it will likely be the means by which site selectors and relocating/expanding companies learn about your community and region.
 - b. On that website, and in other marketing communications, EDOs needs to clearly differentiate their community, beyond "a great place to live, work and play."



- c. Communities need to play well together within a region. It will be to your advantage to continue to work collaboratively with adjoining counties to represent the broader labor pool and regional assets, and to continue to partner with The Missouri Partnership, KCADC, KCP&L, and others.
- d. It will be to your advantage to know what types of projects are a good fit for Grain Valley, Missouri and why.
- 2. Most site selection projects start with a search for an available site or building. (SITES AND BUILDINGS)
 - Virtually all site selection projects start with a search for an available site or building. Therefore, using the state-sponsored LOIS Sites & Buildings database is a requirement for being considered for most projects.
 - b. On a related note, ensuring that listing information is current and complete is also necessary.
 - EDOs need a pipeline of both sites and buildings that are "ready" for development.
- 3. It is likely that Grain Valley will receive the majority of its company relocation and expansion leads from The Missouri Partnership, from KCADC and/or from one of the sponsoring utilities. (RFI RESPONSE AND SITE VISIT)
 - a. EDOs need to provide thorough, strategic, complete and on-time responses to those RFIs for which they are a good fit.
 - b. When a community or region becomes a finalist for a project, how it manages the on-site visit can have a very big impact on whether it gets the project.

Community Positioning

Perceived Economic Assets/Weaknesses

Based on our time on the ground in Grain Valley, our interviews with key employers, and input from various stakeholders, we have identified the following as your area's key perceived economic assets and weaknesses. Note that these are not in rank order within the categories.

Based on the assets identified above, it appears to us that the most likely target for business recruitment efforts are within the manufacturing sector. Secondarily, the distribution required to support manufacturing operations would be a secondary target. Manufacturers value the interstate access, access to workforce, and competitive costs of doing business. Some will require the larger sites that you have (or will soon have). Other excellent assets are the quality of the K-12 schools and availability and affordability of housing, the low median age, and strong population growth. These are all positives for a company to relocate to an area.



Website Presence and Messaging

The key marketing tactic for the City of Grain Valley economic development is the ED pages on the City website (screenshot below). *We recommend that the Grain Valley EDC establish its own, freestanding ED website.* It would still link to the City site, and vice-versa, but would allow you to provide a separate platform for all topics ED.



The home page is empty. This is the ED area's highest value website page, and we suggest that you use it to communicate a strong positioning statement about "Why Grain Valley" along with a map of where Grain Valley is located. This map could serve to reinforce the positionoing by emphasizing Highway 70 proximity along the eastern gateway to the Kansas City metro area. Another map of just the Grain Valley region could show the Interstate, local airport, available sites, etc.


You have a phone number on each page, but should include your personal name, email, and phone number. Believe it or not, contact information is one of the most desired pieces of information on an ED website, and one that is often not provided on every page. If a site selector is on a page, or prints a page off, it is handy to have that information on every page so that we don't have to go looking for it.

One of the most important features of any economic development website is a listing of available sites and buildings. You do list available properties on your website, and you use the LOIS portal to do so.

That said, we have some suggestions for you with regard to how the property owners/developers list their sites on LOIS.




For the small site that you showed us, it does not show up in LOIS based on a search for sites between 2 and 10 acres in size in Grain Valley. Eight other properties do, mostly commercial properties near Buckner Tarsney intersection. See the screen shot below.




For the spec building, the listing only comes up for 98,600 square feet, even though it is divisible. It would have been missed if the search parameters of 30,000 to 50,000 sf were entered. In addition, the information is not up to date, the information is not complete, and it misses the opportunity to show photos of finished building.

Sites and Buildings

The City of Grain Valley included one site and one building in its response to the Project Vanguard RFI, and arranged for us to visit these locations while on-site.

One of the most important criteria is whether Grain Valley populates the LOIS database with complete and timely information on each property. LOIS is on your website. This is a very important and often overlooked economic development activity. Work with the property owners and developers to ensure that listings are current and up to date, as there is a good chance that you are missing leads from consultants who go directly to the LOIS website to find available sites and buildings for projects.

- 3. Technical information: Lacking information about flood plains, environmental testing, etc.
- 4. Zoning: Not zoned for intended use.
- 5. Pad: Site needs leveling.
- 6. Other: Specified in table.

Overall comments for sites and buildings:

- 1. For the RFI, it would have been easier for us (and probably for you) to fill out one RFI for each property.
- 2. At the beginning of the visit, and in the packet, provide an overall map of the city showing where the two subject properties are in relation to the rest of the City. Use this opportunity to help orient us.
- 3. Ensure the site and building are listed on LOIS, and would have come up for the size we were looking for. Put in place a system to update the information regularly (every six months is typical).



- Work to document the many other sites and buildings you showed us on the site visit are in LOIS. Including summaries of the listing sheets in the packet would be helpful.
- 5. For the large Ward property that is in line to be annexed, considering participating in the state's Certified Sites program. It is a very cost-effective program, and with a property of this size, would help in its promotion.

RFI Response

The City acknowledged the RFI immediately upon receipt, and the response was submitted on-time. The response itself was fair, rating 3.2 on a scale of 1.0 to 5.0, with 5.0 being the best. The key strengths were the completeness of the response and the inclusion of value-added information. Areas for improvement include strategic positioning, organization, and creativity.

The response excelled in integrating information from The Missouri Partnership into the response, and in providing detailed information on incentives.

The City of Grain Valley, as mentioned above, submitted a response that was largely complete.

- The RFI was submitted on time, and nearly complete. The only substantive areas with no content was telecommunications and community information.
- The RFI seamlessly incorporated information about Missouri and its business climate, as well as illustrations of incentives.
- Development Process Handbook and Development Application Handbook were clear and left a positive impression that the process is organized and fair.
- Incentives were explained clearly.

Some additional comments and areas for improvement:

- Missed the opportunity to strongly position the community within the region.
- Documents sent seemed to be in no particular order.
- Attachments were not labeled.
- More maps, including one with adjoining uses labeled, would have been helpful.
- Response did not explain that no council approvals would be needed for either of the two properties in
 question. The documentation provided implied that this approval would take either two or three months.



Site Visit

Regarding the site visit itself, the timing was realistic of an actual project. The City had just a few business days to pull together the entire agenda, including the site visits and employer interviews. The on-site visit was well orchestrated and made a productive use of the consultant's time.

Although there was clearly a thoughtful agenda, it was not shared in advance with the consultant team in writing. Please also include the contact information for all of the individuals we will be meeting with, including the employers. This helps us prepare for the meetings instead of walking in cold.

That said, starting us off with a meeting at the community center was an excellent format. This is a useful way to orient us to the community, answer any questions, and adjust the schedule if need be. Grain Valley did an exceptional job at having all the key stakeholders not only in the room, but organized and coordinated to present a concise presentation of the region. Of the five communities we have visited to date on this project, Grain Valley did the best job in terms of getting all of the right stakeholders there, organizing their presentations, and sharing a great deal of information in a concise timeframe. You had the key players there from KCADC, KCP&L and The Missouri Partnership in particular. You didn't even need to say that you work as a team: you demonstrated it just by the fact that they were all there and up to speed on the project.

Handing over the presentation on a jump drive immediately afterwards was very helpful: I didn't have to lug home a three-ring binder, and I did refer to the information included in there later that night when preparing my own stakeholder presentation.

The property visits were well orchestrated and organized. See the comments earlier about having them listed in LOIS. Having property listing sheets as part of the packet would have been helpful.

The employer interviews were scheduled for us as requested. We would have preferred to have visited with some of the manufacturers and distributors in the region, since we were representing a manufacturing company. Examples of companies we would have liked to have interviewed include the following that were listed on your LOIS profile: Kohl's DC (450), GE Transportation Systems (300 employees), Haldex Brake Systems (233), Digital Ally (90), and Design Metals (45).



Strategic Issues

In addition to the items included within the scope of this project, we identified three strategic issues and thoughts for next steps that we wanted to capture as well.

If you consider the City of Grain Valley along the dimensions I outlined in my presentation – Alignment, Readiness, Regionalism and Differentiation – my conclusion is that you have a great deal of economic development substance in your community, and a lot of the pieces in place.

Specifically, the City seems poised for measured, strategic, and continued industrial economic growth. The key factors, in my opinion, are:

- Alignment among city leadership and support of the new EDC function.
- Access to a large, highly productive workforce.
- A community attitude that seems as if it would welcome blue-collar jobs.
- Available housing and great K-12 schools, which removes what are usually two major barriers to companies looking to relocate or expand.
- A significant amount of developable land that is in the process of being annexed into the city, alleviating any
 major concerns about utility service or access.
- · A young and growing demographic base.

The City and EDC should continue to work on alignment issues, to make sure that it communicates effectively with residents during this time of continued growth. Your efforts on regionalism are also very good and should continue to be developed and nurtured. There are a few specific things you can do with regard to readiness – and to your credit, these primarily have to do with property readiness, which neither the City nor EDC directly controls, for the most part. And regarding differentiation, there is room for improvement in sharpening your message, developing your own website presence, and so forth. We assume these have not been completed because of the relatively recent staffing of the EDC.

Our specific recommendations for Grain Valley are as follows:

1. Need for more sites and/or buildings that are "ready."

- a. Continue to move forward on the annexation of the Ward property, and publicize that when it is complete.
- b. Ensure that all industrial properties are listed on the LOIS portal. You may have to do this in lieu of relying on the developers or property owners to make sure it is done right, complete, and updated regularly.
- c. Consider applying for the State of Missouri's Certified Sites program, especially for the Ward property. This program ensures that the proper documentation on each site exists. This certification can help eliminate risk from a site selection standpoint i.e., all things being equal, we're going to have more certainty over a site that is certified rather than one that is not.
- d. Develop your "property pipeline" what's going to be developed after the Ward property, etc., so that you are always looking several years out to ensure you have a constant supply of inventory.



- Ramp up marketing. Grain Valley has a great story, which means that it performs very competitively on a number of location criteria that are important to site selectors. It's time to craft your positioning and get the message out:
 - a. Develop your strongest positioning for the community overall, and for any target industries that it will focus on (e.g. manufacturing, distribution). We call this your positioning, which is then translated into elevator speeches and website content and all that follows.
 - b. Clarify the branding of the EDC.
 - c. Develop a freestanding website for the Grain Valley EDC. It should link to the City website, but provide more economic development information, in depth, than the City website could.
 - d. Develop a marketing plan for the EDC to direct other marketing efforts.
- Build relationships with existing industry. Experience tells us that a significant portion of investment and
 jobs comes from existing employers. You will also need their support to successfully attract new industry to
 the region.
 - a. Conduct regular business retention and expansion interviews with your leading industrial companies.
 - b. Visit the headquarters of local companies whose headquarters are located outside the state.
 - When appropriate, consider creating a Manufacturers Advisory Council to advise on issues important to them.






Economic Development Landing Page - Nothing loads (have to click on LOIS tab)



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

PURPOSE	Pursuant to the elected official compensation study requested by Alderman Johnston, staff is recommending the requested change in elected official compensation. Subsequently, a salary adjustment is being set by this ordinance as well as the addition of a section that mandates elected official salary reviews every five years to ensure the compensation is being regularly reviewed.			

BACKGROUND	The Grain Valley Board of Aldermen receive a small salary for their time serving the City. This is a standard practice within local government and along with salaries, come the need for periodic adjustments. The Grain Valley elected officials received an adjustment in January of 1986 and a subsequent adjustment in February of 2000. Typically, political subdivisions review governing board salaries every five to seven years. In this case, the BOA has received two adjustments over the last forty years, with the most recent being over seventeen years ago.
SPECIAL NOTES	An elected official cannot receive any salary increase within the same term in which they cast the vote for the increase. Since this ordinance is being introduced and voted upon before the swearing in of the new board members, the salary increase will go into effect for the three Aldermen who recently acquired or retained their seat on the April 4, 2017 General Municipal Election. The Mayor and three other Aldermen who are currently midterm will not see an increase during their term. The increase will go into effect for those seats after the April 2018 General Municipal Election.

WHEREAS, Chapter 115, Code of Ordinances, City of Grain Valley, Missouri ("City") relating structure and compensation of City officials has been amended from time to time as permitted under Section 79.270 and following, RSMo, on the same subject; and

WHEREAS, Under Section 79.270 of the Revised Statute of Missouri and Section 115.050 of the City of Grain Valley Codes, the Board of Aldermen have the authority and responsibility to establish compensation for all officers and/or employees of the City; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 1309 establishing the compensation of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen has not been increased since February 14, 2000; and

WHEREAS, While the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, realize those elected to serve do so without concern about financial compensation, they also feel those individuals committed to providing service to their community should not be penalized for the time and service they provide, but should receive a fair and reasonable compensation; and

WHEREAS, These adjustments will not affect those currently serving in their elected term, but will only be effective to those elected to office in the April 4, 2017 General Election and those elected thereafter.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 115: Officers and Employees, Article I Generally, Section 115.050 of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri Municipal Code of Ordinance is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 115.050 Salaries.

A. The Board of Aldermen shall have the power to fix the compensation of all officers of the City. The salary of an elected officer shall not be changed during the time for which he/she was elected. In addition to the fees allowed by this Code or other law or ordinance the City Officers shall receive such compensation for their services as the Board of Aldermen shall from time to time provide.



Re: P&R Replacement Dump Truck

The current dump truck in the Parks and Recreation Fleet is now twenty years old, exceeding the projected lifespan by double. It spent the first twelve years as a plow truck, and the last eight years as a heavy hauling truck for the Parks department. Over the last eight years the dump truck has proven to be a valuable asset to the Parks department. With the ability to haul loads of material to job sites, and pull heavy loads without maxing out the capabilities of the truck. Rust is the major issue with the truck, with the truck rusting in all areas; the time has come to replace it before it becomes a safety issue.

The replacement is a regular cab 2wd one ton dump truck with a gas powered engine. The gas engine was chosen based upon current usage, with short trips between work areas. A diesel engine with the current emissions hardware would be problematic from the short trips not being able to fully get to operating temperature.
