



- Mayor Todd opened the Public Hearing for the establishment of zoning-Southeast Corner of Buckner-Tarsney Rd (HWY BB) and Duncan Road at 7:21 p.m.-
 - This property recently completed the annexation process at the previous Board Meeting; proposed zoning is primarily R1 single family and frontage will be C1, general commercial district
 - Alderman Headley questioned if conversations will be occurring to widen Buckner
 Tarsney or to put turn lanes in; developer will need to work with the State as this is not
 the City's right-of-way; long term this will need to be looked at; Alderman Headley felt
 that soon a turn lane will need to be considered at Buckner Tarsney and Duncan Road as
 well
 - Alderman Bamman asked for clarification on where the boundaries will be for the different zones; Alderman Bamman asked if there would be any barriers between the zones; this will be looked at when the Plat is reviewed for approval

Bill No. B17-20: An Ordinance Amending Traffic Code Schedule II Stop Intersections Section of the City of Grain Valley Municipal Code

City Attorney Jim Cook read **Bill No. B17-20** for its first reading by title only

- Alderman Arnold moved to accept the first reading of **Bill No. B17-20** bringing it back for a second reading by title only
- The Motion was Seconded by Alderman Totton
 - O Discussion is to add four way stops on Montana Ridge and Stockman and Nelson and LeAnn Drive; staff does not recommend approval of these stops signs as it does not meet the MUTDC guidelines; Alderman West asked to give consideration to the public comment regarding a traffic enforcement officer; Alderman Arnold reminded the Board in the past this was discussed and was not in the budget; fines and enforcement were not enough to cover the cost of a dedicated traffic officer; Alderman Arnold felt that current police force was enough to handle the situations; when asked for specific enforcement, officers have been responsive and public comment has shown that they are enforcing traffic; Alderman Arnold felt if the stop signs were recommended by the guidelines then they would have been placed already; the reason for this discussion is for the safety of the public and just because it is not required does not mean it should not be considered-felt it was similar to adding parking regulations
 - O Alderman West asked if the consensus of the residents was to add stop signs in the mentioned locations; Alderman Arnold felt that there have been consistent concerns by residents but no suggestions on how to fix the concerns; felt it was a budgetary issue as well as a safety issue; shared emails that were received from residents; at previous meeting legal issues did not seem to be a concern
 - Alderman Coleman received an email from a resident who is against the stop sign on Montana Ridge and felt it would create traffic issues; residents are likely split close to even on those who would favor signs versus those who would not
 - Alderman Bamman referred to emails distributed this evening; emails referenced
 a flier; questioned if the City passed out fliers; Alderman Arnold shared he passed
 out the fliers; Alderman Bamman would like notice if his name is attached to a
 flier in the future; Alderman Bamman reminded the Board that he had in the past

- The Motion was Seconded by Alderman Headley
 - o Ordinance recommends no parking signs are placed on NE Clear Creek Drive, NE Coldwater Creek Drive, NE Deer Creek Drive and NE Wolf Creek Drive; City Engineer has the authority to determine which areas are designated "no parking" if road is a less than a specific width
 - o Mayor Todd shared this was also posted on his Facebook page; one comment was made in relation to this topic and that person felt this would not allow for sufficient parking in the area
 - o Alderman Coleman reminded the Board that four homeowners showed up to the previous meeting and were in favor of the ordinance
 - o Alderman Totton asked Bonnie Mccolgin, resident of Creekside Village and in attendance, why other residents were not getting involved; only nine residents in the subdivision are homeowners and the rest are rentals; Ms. Mccolgin shared concerns that if parking is not limited that emergency vehicles will not be able to make it down the road

 - o RFP is issued every three years for pool management services; Mr. Davies shared that this RFP was put out in July; two bids were received, references were checked and research was completed on both entities; would like to move forward with Midwest Pool Management
 - Alderman Arnold asked for confirmation that this was the same pool service used since 2009; Mr. Davies confirmed and shared that services have been very satisfactory; Midwest Pool Management focuses on municipal aquatic facilities
 - Alderman Headley asked if rebates are allowed for weather issues; salary
 proposal is based on when the pool is scheduled to be open; the days the pool is
 opened up late, closes early, or not opened at all are not charged; full amount is
 paid up front and reimbursement is received at the end of the season; in 2016,
 over \$8,000 was received
 - Alderman Coleman asked if the City keeps records in addition to the pool service records so they can be compared; City retains employees for the concession and pool gate, swim lessons, and private pool rentals; part of the concession workers job is to document when they close early, open late, etc.



Chief,

In response to the RFP package that was delivered to Service Providers on 7/24/17 we received packets from three (3) Service Providers. Packets were received from:

Crain Veterinary Center 1340 NW Jefferson, Grain Valley, MO

Grain Valley Animal Hospital 116 Main, Grain Valley, MO

Oak Grove Animal Clinic 1604 S. Broadway, Oak Grove, MO

After the packets were received they were distributed to the committee selected to evaluate the packets and make a recommendation to you of a provider for animal care services. The committee consisted of Christine Thompson, Jacqueline Sparks and myself.

Each member of the committee was instructed to review each of the packets and score each provider on the Evaluation Criteria Proposal Ranking Sheet, and a meeting was set for 8/22/17 to discuss the proposals and determine which provider would be recommended.

At this meeting the Evaluation Criteria Proposal Ranking Sheets were evaluated and the average score for each provider was calculated, the scores are as follows:

Oak Grove Animal Clinic – 79 Crain Veterinary Center – 73 Grain Valley Animal Hospital – 72

In addition to the scores each of the providers proposals were discussed in detail and the following are specific items that were brought up:

Crain Veterinary Center

Despite being located in Grain Valley and having a large facility there were items in the proposal that were of concern to the committee. First was the lack of after-hours Emergency Care Services as stated on the proposal that "After-Hours: An area would be issued for animal drop off (as most emergency care can wait til doctors are in)". Another area of concern was the procedures for animals on rabies quarantine that allow owners to visit the animals, and even require the owners of animals on rabies quarantine that are deemed aggressive to come and handle the animals up to twice a day. These are not acceptable practices for quarantined animals.

Grain Valley Animal Hospital

Grain Valley Animal Hospital is the current animal care services provider for the City of Grain Valley. While the location is very convenient and prices are low, there are concerns based not only on the proposal, but on past performance. One such concern is the number of available kennels for use by the city which is listed as three (3) for each type of animal as compared to ten (10) to twenty-five (25) listed in the other proposals. This lack of kennel space has also been brought up to ACO Sparks when she goes to impound animals at Grain Valley Animal Hospital which she does frequently. There have also been issues with the customer service at Grain Valley Animal Hospital regarding comments made by staff in the presence of animal owners, including one incident where ACO Sparks had to take pictures of a dog that was on a rabies quarantine each day and send them to the owners to assure them that nothing had happened to their dog because of comments that had been made to them by staff. There have also been issues with billing in the past where long periods of time would pass with no bills being sent to GVPD for services.

Oak Grove Animal Clinic

Despite being located in Oak Grove, five (5) miles from Grain Valley City Hall, and having higher prices for some services, this proposal was the most complete and was determined to provide the best service of the proposals that were received. Of most concern was the increased cost of disposal of deceased animals, however this is a service that we are looking at possibly contracting with a provider that actually does the disposal rather than going through the Animal Care provider for deceased animals that are picked up by Animal Control. Oak Grove Animal Clinic is also currently the provider of animal care services for the City of Oak Grove and is the animal care provider for the Grain Valley Police K-9, Sgt. Scott Hedger said that he had been very been very satisfied with the services that they have provided.

It is the recommendation of the committee that the contract for Animal Care Services for the City of Grain Valley be awarded to the Oak Grove Animal Clinic.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AND SELECTION PROCESS

The City of Grain Valley, Missouri, invites you to submit a proposal and statement of qualifications for Animal Care Services for the period of two years from the commencement of contract execution with two (2) optional one year extensions if agreed by both the City and the selected service provider(s).

Introduction:

The City of Grain Valley, Missouri, invites you to submit a sealed proposal for Animal Care Services for the City of Grain Valley's Animal Control. These services will provide animal-related services such as boarding and veterinary care for animals that are within the care of Grain Valley Animal Control. Prospective respondents are advised to read this information over carefully prior to submitting proposal.

One (1) signed original and two (2) hard copies of the proposal should be submitted to the office of Grain Valley Police by 2:00 PM, August 10, 2017. Proposal shall be submitted in a sealed envelope clearly marked "Animal Care Services" and addressed to:

Such contact shall be for clarification purposes only. The City must receive all questions no later than 5:00 PM August 3, 2017. Changes, if any occur, to the scope of services or proposal procedures will only be transmitted by written addendum and delivered to all RFP recipients. Addendums and answers to submitted questions will also be delivered to all RFP recipients.

Submitted proposals will NOT be accepted by fax or electronically.

Late Proposals:

Proposals arriving after the specified date and time will NOT be considered, nor will late proposals be opened. Each respondent assumes responsibility for timely submission of its proposal.

Withdrawal or Modifications of Proposals:

Any proposal may be withdrawn or modified by a written request signed by the respondent and received by the Grain Valley Police Department prior to the final time and date for the receipt of proposals. Once the deadline is past, respondents are obligated to fulfill the terms of their proposal.

Proposal Acceptance and Rejection:

The City of Grain Valley reserves the right to accept any proposal, to reject any and all proposals if said rejection is deemed in the best interest of the City, to call for new proposals, and/or to award the contract to other than the lowest proposal if deemed "proposal most advantageous to the City".

Proposal Evaluation and Award:

Evaluation will be made on the basis of the criteria noted in "Selection Criteria" below. Award shall be made to the respondent(s) whose proposal is determined in writing to be the most advantageous to the City, taking into consideration adherence to the included specifications and price and to negotiate the fees and service delivery contemplated in this solicitation and in submitted proposals. The City reserves the right to make multiple awards if deemed to be in the City's best interest. The City will enter into a contract with the successful respondent(s) for the specified products, services, etc. All respondent(s) that were not selected by the City shall be notified in writing. Nothing herein shall obligate the City to award a contract to any respondent.

Selection Criteria

The proposals will be evaluated by a Selection Committee comprised of selected City personnel. Proposals and recommendations will be forwarded to the City Administrator for consideration. The City Administrator, at his discretion, may elect to accept staff recommendations, request presentations from respondents, and/or seek the advice of a sub-committee. After the City staff has evaluated the RFPs, the top respondent(s) will be recommended to the Board of Aldermen for ordinance approval. The Board of Aldermen will then vote on the new ordinance and proposed contract in two separate meetings. Once the Board of Aldermen has passed the new ordinance and accepted the proposed contract, the respondent(s) will be asked to sign the Contract. After commencement of the contract execution, animal care services may begin with the new service provider(s).

Evaluation of respondents' proposal(s) and interview(s) by the selection committee will be based on the following criteria:

- Qualifications, experience, and references
- Personnel, staffing, and hours of service
- Customer service, etc.
- Rates and fees
- Quality and responsiveness of the proposal

Waiver of Irregularities:

The City retains the right, in its sole discretion, to waive any irregularities in proposals that do not comply with the strict requirements of this RFP, and the City reserves the right to award a contract to a respondent submitting any such non-compliant proposal, all in the City's sole discretion.

Validity of Pricing:

Respondents are required to provide fees for requested products and services, including, if applicable, the hourly rate of the principles to be assigned to the matter. No cost increases shall be passed onto the City after the proposal has been submitted. No attempt shall be made to tie any item or items contained in this RFP with any other business with the City.

Qualification/Inspection/Interviews:

Proposals will only be considered from respondents normally engaged in providing the types of products and services specified herein. The City reserves the right to inspect the respondents' facilities, products, personnel, and organization at any time, or to take any other action necessary to determine respondents' ability to perform. The City reserves the right to reject proposals where evidence or evaluation is determined to indicate inability to perform. The City reserves the right to interview any or all respondents and/or to award a contract without conducting interviews. If the respondent is not licensed, willing and/or able to provide any product(s) and/or service(s) in any part of this RFP, please draw a visible "X" over entire area that is not applicable.

Acceptance and Conditions

The products and/or services supplied in response to the RFP award shall remain the property of the respondent until a physical inspection is made and the products and/or services are accepted to the satisfaction of the City. The products and/or services must comply fully with the terms of this RFP, be of the required quality and new unless specified by the City. Any substitutes of products and/or services not meeting specifications will be rejected, and returned if applicable, at the respondent's expense. The City will make payment only after receipt and acceptance of products and/or services.

Payment Terms:

Payment on non-disputed invoices will be paid within 45 days from date of receipt of invoice. In submitting proposals under these specifications, service provider(s) should take into account all discounts, both trade and time, allowed in accordance with the above payment policy.

Performance:

It is the intention of the City to acquire products or services as specified herein from respondent(s) that will give prompt and convenient service and offer reasonable fees. Any such contract will be non-exclusive, and the City reserves the right to seek products or services from other sources, in the City's sole discretion.

Term of Contract:

The term of the contract will be for a specific period of time, commencing upon contract execution and ending after two years. The contract may be extended twice for the period of one year per extension by mutual agreement of the two parties.

Change Orders:

If, in the course of performance of the resulting Contract, the service provider or the City proposes changes to the Contract, and informal consultation with the other party indicates that a change in the terms and conditions of the Contract may be warranted, service provider or the City may request a change in the Contract. The parties to the Contract will meet to discuss and negotiate the required change order documents. Upon completion of those negotiations, the negotiated change order documents will be submitted to the City for approval. Upon approval by the City, an "Order to Proceed" with the approved changes will be submitted to service provider. Any Amendment to the Contract will not render ineffective or invalidate any unaffected portions of the Contract.

Cost of Preparing Proposals:

The City is not liable for any costs incurred by the respondent(s) in responding to this RFP.

Disposal of Proposals:

All proposals become the property of the City and will be a matter of record. The City shall have the right to use all ideas, or adaptations of those ideas, contained in any proposal received in response to this RFP. Selection or rejection of this proposal will not affect this right.

Verbal Instructions:

No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed with the respondent as a result of any discussion with any City employee. Only those communications from respondents, which are signed and in writing will be recognized by the City, as duly authorized expressions on behalf of the respondent.

Records:

Service provider shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to labor costs, material expenses, and other such information required by the City that relates to the performance of services under this Contract. Service provider shall maintain adequate records of services provided in sufficient detail to permit an evaluation of services. All such records shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall be clearly identified and readily accessible and in a form acceptable to the City, which the City may specify and change from time to time. Service provider shall provide free access to the representatives of the City or its designees, at reasonable times, to such books and records; shall give the City the right to examine and audit said books and records; shall permit the City to make transcripts thereof as necessary; and shall allow inspection by the City of all work, data, documents, proceedings, and activities related to any future Contract arising from this RFP. Such records, together with supporting documents, shall be maintained for a period of at least three (3) years after receipt of final payment.

2 NEGOTIATION

The City reserves the right to negotiate any and all elements of this proposal.

3 TAX EXEMPT

The City and its Agencies are exempt from State and local sales taxes. Sites of all transactions derived from this proposal shall be deemed to have been accomplished within the State of Missouri.

4 RIGHTS RESERVED

The City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to waive any minor informality or irregularity in any proposal, and to make award to the response deemed to be most advantageous to the City.

5 RESPONDENT PROHIBITED

Respondents are prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting, or otherwise disposing of this proposal or any resultant agreement or its rights, title, or interest therein or its power to execute such agreement to any other person, company or corporation without the previous written approval of the City.

6 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

The City, or any of its agencies, will not hold harmless or indemnify any respondent for any liability whatsoever.

7 HOLD HARMLESS

The service provider shall agree to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold the Board of Aldermen, City of Grain Valley, MO, its officers, commissions, employees and agents free and harmless from and against any and all losses, penalties, damages, settlements, costs, charges, professional fees or other expenses or liabilities of every kind and character resulting from the error, omission or negligent act of the service provider, its agents, employees or representatives, in the performance of the service provider's duties under any agreement resulting from award of this proposal.

8 LAW GOVERNING

All contractual agreements shall be subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri.

9 ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

10 CONFLICTS

A violation of this provision renders the contract void. Federal conflict of interest regulations and applicable provisions of Sections 105.450 – 105.496 shall not be violated. Respondent covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services to be performed under this contract. Respondent further covenants that in the performance of this contract no person having such interest shall be employed.

11 LOW-COST

Low-cost is defined as offered at a lower price than generally offered to the public through the service provider while maintaining ethical and legal practices in application.

SCOPE OF VETERINARY SERVICES, MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS, AND FEES

1 SCOPE OF SERVICES


The successful service provider(s) shall provide any and/or all services and/or products involved in the care of impounded, sick, and/or injured animals; shall provide reduced cost veterinary services for residents through the animal control program; and may be asked to participate in animal control programs and events. Services and/or products include, but are not limited to the following:

- A Veterinarian Services: Service provider shall provide up to 8 hours of veterinarian services five days a week. The City will bear no additional costs for phone consultations. Veterinarian services may include, but are not limited to, examining, diagnosing, and/or treating impounded, sick, injured and/or stray animals brought in by Grain Valley Animal Control staff or designees of the City; providing guidance to staff on follow-up treatment; responding to emergency requests during both business hours and after-hours; perform euthanasia when necessary; offer low-cost microchip, vaccination, and veterinary services on request; and any other services and/or products as needed.
- B Type of Animal(s) to Be Treated: Service provider shall provide services for any domestic, exotic, small wildlife, and large and/or small livestock animals. Service provider shall specify which type(s) of animals may be treated, observed, and/or boarded at their facility.
- Professional Assistance for Animal Investigations: Service provider shall provide professional evaluation and advice to Grain Valley Animal Control staff concerning the medical and health conditions of animals suspected to be the object of cruelty, neglect or other unlawful activity. This may, by necessity, require prompt office visits by a licensed veterinarian along with written documentation of the condition and treatment of the animal. Service provider shall provide detailed reports with supporting document and photographs of any suspect animals as requested by the City.

2 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

The Service Provider(s) shall be:

- A An active Missouri Licensed Veterinarian (must submit a copy of license).
- B Licensed to perform euthanasia (must provide copy).
- C Required to have an active DEA license (must provide copy).
- **D** Required to have an active business license with the municipality where the facility is located (must provide copy).
- E Required to have an active AVMA license (must provide copy).
- F Required to maintain certifications and license(s).
- G Available for telephone consultation after-hours, weekends, and holidays, for emergencies.
- **H** Required to maintain all necessary records.
- I Required to carry a worker's compensation, liability, and malpractice insurance policy with the City insured as a rider on each of the policies.



Grain Valley Animal Control holds all impounded animals for five (5) business days. After the five business days have passed the impounded animals are eligible for adoption. Animal Control also on occasion has animals surrendered to them. There are two possible actions to release an animal from hold.

- Option 1 is the City surrenders the animals to the service provider to release the animals to rescue, euthanize, or keep for adoption. The City is not responsible for any services provided after the animal is released to service provider. However, the City still retains the right to send dogs to a rescue rather than sign the animal over to the service provider when the five business days are over.
- Option 2 is for the City to provide continued payment of care while finding rescues, or adoptive homes for the animals. With option two, the service provider will only receive the accrued fees of services provided
