





Meeting called to order by Secretary Terry Hill at 7:00 pm.

CONSENT AGENDA:

a. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES:</u> Motion by Norm Combs, second by Don Caslavka to approve the minutes from the December 19 meeting. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

a. REVIEW OF ACCOUNTS PAYABLE/EXPENDITURES/REVENUES: Shannon highlighted and explained the more notable expenditures in the summary report including the costs of the annual RecDesk subscription and the purchase of two bounce houses. Also listed were a new engine for the Dodge Durango and a new desktop computer for the pool gate/concession stand.

CITIZEN COMMENTS:

a. None.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- **a.** Veteran's Tribute
 - i. Norm Combs stated that the Pathways of Honor committee are looking at fundraising opportunities. Specifically a barbeque competition or attending a gun show.

OLD BUSINESS:

- a. Dillingham Trail Project Shannon Davies
 - i. Park Maintenance and Public Works are working on the drainage issue at the south end of the trail. Once the weather allows, they will finish installing drain grates that will drain any water on the shoulder to the creek.
- **b.** Cross Creek Trail Project Shannon Davies
 - i. Nothing new to report.
- **c. Park Security** Shannon Davies
 - i. There are several cameras that need to be replaced at Monkey Mountain Park.

- ii. We received a little over \$9,000 in Safety Credit funds from Midwest Public Risk, which was earmarked to fund these replacement cameras.
- iii. The project did not completed in 2017 so those funds got put in Park Reserves at the end of the fiscal year.
- iv. Shannon has an ordinance before the Board of Aldermen to amend the 2018 Budget to pull those funds out of park reserves to pay for the replacement cameras scheduled to be installed next month.

d. Year End Report – Shannon Davies

i. Shannon provided a rough draft of the 2017 Year End Report for the board to review and asked for any feedback at the next meeting.

e. Park Improvements – Shannon Davies

- i. Shannon brought sample illustrations of smaller shelters for Butterfly Trail including the proposed costs (\$3,226 for one unit, \$11,937.25 for three units). The pricing for these structures was over what we had budgeted for in 2018 (\$6,636).
- ii. The board requested that Shannon check to see if we have any local vendors that can fabricate these structures for less cost and report back at the next meeting.
- iii. Shannon requested that at some point, the park board will need to identify the location of placement for these structures along the trail.

NEW BUSINESS:

a. Background Screening for Volunteer Coaches – Shannon Davies

i. Shannon stated that they are in the process of amending this ordinance to include screening youth volunteers through GVPR for crimes at the state and federal level. The current process only involves a screening through the Division of Family Services, which only reports findings (abuse, neglect, maltreatment) related to a child. This new process will be more costly but more thorough.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. Operational Updates

- a. We have a candidate identified to fill the vacant F/T Park Maintenance Worker position. The background check on this individual is currently underway.
- b. The Board of Aldermen did amend the existing agreement with Jackson County to now include the inspection of public/semi-private aquatic venues in Grain Valley.
- c. Registration for spring, youth baseball and softball ended two days ago but we are still accepting late registrations. Participation levels are looking great.

ITEM VII: CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

- Autumn Chambers, 109 W. Broadway, and Rose McLaughlin, 111 Broadway, shared their concerns with noise levels and activities at Charley's Roadhouse which is located behind their homes; shared concerns about bar patrons congregating outside of the building, offensive events occurring in the backlot, urination on residential property; multiple complaints have been filed with the Police Department; concerns were brought to the Board of Aldermen's attention in May of 2016 and problems have persisted; would like a resolution to the noise level first and foremost; a petition from neighbors who also have concerns was provided for the record
 - Mayor Todd asked Chief Starbuck for the volume of calls; calls have been numerous and citations have been given

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- Alderman Totton asked how long residents have lived in the area and if they knew
 the bar was operating when they moved in; length of residency varied and
 although the bar was known, additional concerns have occurred since moving in
- Mr. Arroyo noted that multiple code violations are in progress; additions to the building have been non-permitted and are in process for General Ordinance Summons; Charley's Roadhouse has two pending Disturbing the Peace Charges; additional calls will be added to the case file
- Mr. Hunt asked the Board to consider what decisions need to be made between the citations and the police calls; when granted a 3AM license it was agreed upon that no activity would occur outside of the building
- Mayor Todd has been on the phone with Ms. Chambers and could hear the noise level and music through the phone
- Mr. Geary advised that the citations needed to go through the court process and violations of liquor license permits should go through the Board of Aldermen
- Ms. Chambers asked if there was a specific noise ordinance; Disturbing the Peace is the option the City has; Conditional Use Permits with noise restrictions only apply to special zoning areas
- Members of the board discussed convening to review the continued violations and whether or not a Public Hearing should occur for Revocation of License; Mr. Geary would like time to review the Ordinances and advise on future proceedings
- Chief Starbuck noted that last year the owner was cited for Disturbing the Peace but the case was dismissed
- Chief Starbuck and Captain Beale met with the owner and night manager last week and laid out expectations; Mayor Todd asked if the Board would prefer to wait and see if things improve since the meeting with the police occurred or if the Board would like to meet with the owner(s); Alderman Bamman would like a hearing to listen to both sides regarding the action as the complaints are clear
- Mr. Hunt will bring an executive summary with violations to the April 9th Board of Aldermen meeting and at that time, a decision on the next course of action can be made; Alderman Headley would like to see the Building Code violations included in the summary

-Mayor Todd Opened the Public Hearing for the zoning change of city owned property at 7:30p.m.-

- Mr. Murphy asked the Board to refer to the aerial photo provided of the property in discussion; the property is 16 acres north of Tisha Lane and is currently zoned Agricultural; request is to change zoning to R1 Single family which mirrors land around the area; North side of the property cannot be built on as it is a streamline restoration site; it was planned for this to be developed in the early 2000's but with the economic downturn this was not completed; city currently owns the land and felt R1 single family would be the best use
- Mayor Todd shared, in the order of transparency, that he owns a lot that backs up to the property
- Alderman Totton shared her conversation with a resident unhappy with the homes being built; Mr. Murphy spoke to the same resident who was under the impression that the field would remain undeveloped; Mr. Murphy shared the various options for the lots with the resident and how it was decided that residential lots would be the best option for those already residing in the area

 - Radar speed trailers run from \$6,000-\$8,000; signs which are commonly attached to a light pole run from \$2,500-\$3,200
 - Chief Starbuck shared that other cities have a program where citizens are trained as volunteers to run radar and take a reading only-if vehicle is over 10 mph license plate numbers are taken down and some departments will send warning notice; Chief Starbuck would like to research more about the program-several agencies are doing it but would like to learn more about potential liabilities or downsides to the program; shared concerns about potential for confrontations when citizens aren't aware of the program



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 242 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI, PERTAINING TO BACKGROUND AND RECORDS CHECKS FOR COACHES AND VOLUNTEERS OF YOUTH RECREATIONAL PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, it is a necessity for all youth to have a safe playing environment while participating in the City's programs at City facilities; and

WHEREAS, screening coaches/volunteers for a history of certain criminal offenses is a reasonable way to contribute to a safe playing environment; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the City of the City of Grain Valley has determined it to be in the best interest of the citizens of the City to amend Chapter 242 to reflect the changes to Sections 242.010, 242.020 and 242.030.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

CHAPTER 242: BACKGROUND AND RECORDS CHECKS FOR COACHES AND VOLUNTEERS OF YOUTH RECREATIONAL SPORTS

SECTION 242.010 BACKGROUND AND RECORDS CHECKS REQUIRED

All coaches and volunteers involved with the instruction of any youth, recreational program utilizing City facilities shall be required to submit to criminal records checks and that all coaches and volunteers whose records check reveals a history of certain criminal offenses shall be disqualified from participation.

SECTION 242.020 DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this requirement, the following terms shall have the meanings stated hereafter:

BACKGROUND RECORDS CHECK

- a. National Criminal Database Search
- b. 50 State Sex Offender Registry Search
- c. Local Criminal record, search county of current residence or longest and most current residency (checks must be done physically at the local county courthouse and go back a minimum of ten years).
- d. Social Security Number Verification to validate both legal name and address history.

CITY FACILITIES

Any property belonging to the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, including buildings, courts, diamonds, fields or any other play or practice area whatsoever.

CITY PROGRAM

Any recreational activity being managed by employees of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri.

COACHES/VOLUNTEERS

Those persons eighteen (18) years of age and older having contact with youth participating in City, youth, athletic activities and/or recreational programs by teaching, training or supervising, including those with a child participating in City, youth, athletic activity and/or recreational programs with others.

DISQUALIFY

A permanent ban on being a coach or volunteer for any youth athletic activity or recreational program managed by the City of Grain Valley, Missouri.

Criminal Offenses

Any arrest or conviction for a misdemeanor or felony offense involving violence, any arrest or conviction for any felony or misdemeanor offense involving physical or sexual abuse or neglect of a child, any felony or misdemeanor offense involving the exploitation of children and any dangerous felony. These offenses include applicants who have been found guilty following a trial, entered a guilty plea, entered a no contest plea accompanied by a court finding of guilty, regardless of whether there was an adjudication of guilt (conviction) or a withholding of guilt.

SECTION 242.030 PROCEDURE

- A. All coaches/volunteers shall be required to submit to a criminal records check at least ten (10) days prior to beginning any City program and utilizing any City facilities.
 - 1. Each coach and volunteers shall complete an application granting the City and Grain Valley Parks and Recreation vendor permission to conduct the Criminal Records Checks.
 - 2. Each coach and volunteer shall complete a background screening conducted by the Grain Valley Parks and Recreation vendor.
 - 3. Any coach or volunteer who has undergone this procedure involved with a City program and/or using City facilities within the same twelve (12) month period need not submit the form unless he or she has an arrest or conviction that would result in new information on the records check.
- B. The Grain Valley Parks and Recreation Department shall be responsible for conducting the records checks through the department's designated provider.

- 1. The Parks and Recreation Department shall receive and review the results of all records checks.
- 2. The Parks and Recreation Department shall notify the coach or volunteer submitting the request if the records check reveals any history of applicable criminal offenses.
- 3. The Parks and Recreation Department shall maintain the results of all criminal records checks for a period of five (5) years.
- 4. All information received as a result of the background check will be kept confidential and not disclosed outside of the Grain Valley Parks and Recreation Department.
- C. Any coach or volunteer notified that a records check revealed criminal offenses (within the parameters stated above) shall disqualify the coach/volunteer.
 - 1. The Parks and Recreation Department shall notify any coach or volunteer whose criminal records check revealed applicable criminal offenses that he or she will be disqualified from participating as a coach or volunteer.
 - 2. The Parks and Recreation Department will further notify a disqualified coach or volunteer that he or she may obtain a copy of the information resulting in disqualification from the Parks and Recreation Department.
 - 3. The Parks and Recreation Department will further notify any disqualified coach or volunteer of his or her right to appeal the disqualification.
 - 4. The City and its employees are not responsible for errors and omissions that may be reported on the background checks.
- D. A coach or volunteer disqualified due to a criminal records check may appeal that disqualification.
 - 1. All appeals must be made in writing and delivered to the parks and Recreation Department within ten (10) calendar days after a coach or volunteer is notified of the disqualification.
 - 2. Appeals will be heard by the Parks and Recreation Director. The coach or volunteer making the appeal will be entitled to meet with the Parks and Recreation Director and present any evidence relevant to his or her criminal history.
 - 3. The Parks and Recreation Director will render a decision in writing and that decision will be final.

<u>Chapter 242. Background and Records Checks for Coaches and Volunteers of Youth Recreational Programs</u>

Section 242.010. Background and Records Checks Required.

[Ord. No. 1883 §1, 2-26-2007; Ord. No. 1913 §1, 7-23-2007]

All coaches and volunteers involved with the instruction of any City of Grain Valley or Grain Valley Athletic Association—youth recreational program utilizing City facilities shall be required to submit to criminal background—records checks_and that all, any—coaches or volunteers whose records check reveals a history of inappropriate behavior or activity—certain criminal offenses_shall be disqualified from participation.

Section 242.020. Definitions.

[Ord. No. 1883 §2, 2-26-2007; Ord. No. 1913 §2, 7-23-2007]

For purposes of this requirement, the following terms shall have the meanings stated hereafter:

BACKGROUND RECORDS CHECK

- a. National Criminal Database Search
- b. 50 State Sex Offender Registry Search
- c. Local Criminal record, search county of current residence or longest and most current residency (checks must be done physically at the local county courthouse and go back a minimum of ten years).
- d. Social Security Number Verification to validate both legal name and address history.

A Missouri State Highway Patrol and/or Missouri Department of Social Services Child Abuse or Neglect/Criminal Records Screening, and any further checks needed to explain the results of that check.

CITY FACILITIES

Any property belonging to the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, including buildings, courts, diamonds, fields or any other play or practice area whatsoever.

CITY PROGRAM

Any recreational activity being managed by employees of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri.

COACHES/VOLUNTEERS

Those persons seventeen eighteen (4718) years of age and older having contact with youth participating in Grain ValleyCity, youth, athletic activities and/or recreational programs by teaching, training or supervising, including those with a child participating in Grain Valley youth, athletic activity and/or recreational programs with others.

DISQUALIFY

A permanent ban on being a coach or volunteer for any youth athletic activity or recreational program managed by the City of Grain Valley, Missouri.

INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR Criminal Offenses

Any arrest or conviction for a misdemeanor or felony offense involving violence, any arrest or conviction for any felony or misdemeanor offense involving physical or sexual abuse or neglect of a child, any felony or misdemeanor offense involving the exploitation of children and any dangerous felony. These offenses include applicants who have been found guilty following a trial, entered a guilty plea, entered a no contest plea accompanied by a court finding of guilty, regardless of whether there was an adjudication of guilt (conviction) or a withholding of guilt.

Section 242.030. Procedure.

[Ord. No. 1883 §3, 2-26-2007; Ord. No. 1913 §3, 7-23-2007]

All coaches and volunteers shall be required to submit to a criminal background records check at least tenhirty (130) days prior to beginning any City program and utilizing any City facilities.

Each coach and volunteer shall complete an application granting the City and Grain Valley Parks and Recreation vendor permission to conduct the Criminal records ChecksApplication for Youth Programs Volunteer and Youth Sport Coach granting the City permission to conduct the background and records checks.

Each coach and volunteer shall complete a background screening conducted by the Grain Valley Parks and Recreation vendor. Request for Child Abuse or Neglect/Criminal Record Screening addressed to the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Missouri Division of Social Services.

Each coach and volunteer shall return all request forms in a sealed envelope addressed to the Director of the Grain Valley Parks and Recreation Department marked "Confidential".

Any coach or volunteer who has undergone this procedure involved with a City program and/or using City facilities within the same twelve (12) month period need not submit the form unless he or she has an arrest or conviction that would result in new information on the records check.

The Grain Valley Parks and Recreation Department shall be responsible for conducting the records checks through the department's designated provider.

The Parks and Recreation Department shall receive and review the results of all records checks promptly submit all requests for records checks to the proper agency.

All information received as a result of the background check will be kept confidential and not disclosed outside of the Grain Valley Parks and Recreation Department.

Any coach or volunteer who has been notified that a records check revealed criminal offenses (within the parameters stated above) inappropriate behavior or activity shall disqualify the coach or volunteer.

The Parks and Recreation Department shall notify any coach or volunteer whose records check revealed applicable criminal offenses inappropriate behavior that he or she will be disqualified from participating as a coach or volunteer.

The Parks and Recreation Department will further notify a disqualified coach or volunteer that he or she may obtain a copy of the information resulting in disqualification from the Parks and Recreation Department.

The Parks and Recreation Department will further notify any disqualified coach or volunteer of his or her right to appeal the disqualification.

The City and its employees are not responsible for errors and omissions that may be reported on the background checks.

A coach or volunteer disqualified due to a records check may appeal that disqualification.

<u>1.</u>

All appeals must be made in writing and delivered to the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department within ten (10) calendar days after a coach or volunteer has been notified of the disqualification.

All appeals will be heard by the Parks and Recreation Director. The coach or volunteer will be entitled to meet with the Parks and Recreation Director to present any evidence relevant to his or her criminal history and the disqualification.

The Parks and Recreation Director will then render a decision in writing, and that decision will be final.

SUBJECT: LOADER PURCHASE

DATE: MARCH 30TH, 2018

Our existing Kawasaki 65ZIV-2 loader is a 2001 model year with over 7,500 hours of service. In 2016 staff expended \$8,000 in brake system replacements and had expected to spend in the 2018 fiscal budget an additional \$20,000 on a motor rebuilt in an attempt to extend its replacement life.

Late last year however, this machine was involved in an accident resulting in an employee injury. This issue was brought before the Board of Alderman during the 2018 budget discussions and due to the existing issues and expected expenditures, the Board included in the 2018 budget funds for a replacement machine.

As for the Kawasaki, after a detailed investigation, it was discovered that a problem existed with the hydraulic quick coupler system. Through professional recommendation, the hydraulic coupler system has been replaced with welded pins to remove this portion of the machine from service.

For a suitable replacement Public Works staff received nine demonstration loaders of comparable size and performance. Loaders from the MoDOT bid list, National Joint Powers Alliance Cooperative Purchasing Contracts, and machines not associated with a bid list were considered. Machines from John Deer, Case, Komatsu, CAT, Doosan, and Volvo were tested. Please see attached the Wheel Loader Notes spread sheet outlining all comparative factors. After many hours of staff review and mechanical comparison it was agreed that for the performance, size, power, price and warranty the Volvo L60H best fits the needs of public works operations.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE OFFERING FOR SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI

WHEREAS, the City of Grain Valley, Missouri (the "City"), has selected the firm of Gilmore & Bell, P.C., as bond counsel ("Bond Counsel"), and Springsted Incorporated, as municipal advisor (the "Municipal Advisor") for a series of general obligation refunding bonds in the approximate principal amount of \$3,520,000 (the "Bonds") for the purpose of current refunding the City's outstanding General Obligation Bonds, Series 2008A (the "Series 2008A Bonds") maturing in 2019 and thereafter (the "Refunded Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to authorize the offering for sale of the Bonds pursuant to a competitive public sale and to authorize the Municipal Advisor, Bond Counsel and the officers and officials of the City to proceed with the preparation, review and distribution of documents for the sale.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

SECTION 1: The Municipal Advisor, Bond Counsel and the officers and officials of the City are hereby authorized to proceed with preparation of a notice of bond sale (the "Notice of Bond Sale"), a preliminary official statement (the "Preliminary Official Statement") and a final official statement (the "Official Statement") to provide for the competitive public sale of the Bonds. The final terms of the Bonds shall be determined and approved by subsequent ordinance of the Board of Aldermen of the City. The Refunded Bonds expected to be refunded consist of all the outstanding Series 2008A Bonds, in the outstanding principal amount of \$3,470,000.

SECTION 2: The Board of Aldermen hereby authorizes the execution of the Official Statement by the Mayor, the City Administrator, the Finance Director, the City Clerk or other appropriate officers and officials of the City with such changes and additions thereto as such officers or officials shall deem necessary or appropriate, such officer's or official's signature thereon being conclusive evidence of such officer's or official's and the City's approval thereof. The Board of Aldermen hereby consents to the use and public distribution by the Municipal Advisor of the Notice of Bond Sale and the Preliminary Official Statement in connection with the competitive public sale of the Bonds. The Municipal Advisor is hereby authorized and directed to distribute the Notice of Bond Sale and the Preliminary Official Statement to such banks and investment banking firms and other financial institutions located in the State of Missouri and elsewhere that might be interested in the purchase of the Bonds.

SECTION 3: For the purpose of enabling the successful bidder on the Bonds (the "Purchaser") to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12(b)(1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission, the Mayor, the City Administrator, the Finance Director, the City Clerk or other appropriate officers and officials of the City are hereby authorized, if requested, to provide the Purchaser a letter or certification to the effect that the City deems the information contained in the Preliminary Official Statement to be "final" as of its date, except for the omission of such information as is permitted by Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), and to take such other actions or execute such other documents as such officers or officials in their reasonable judgment deem necessary to enable the Purchaser to comply with the requirements of such Rule.

SECTION 4: The City agrees to provide to the Purchaser within seven business days of the date of the agreement to purchase the Bonds or within sufficient time to accompany any confirmation that requests payment from any customer of the Purchaser, whichever is earlier, an electronic copy of the final Official Statement to enable the Purchaser to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12(b)(4) of the Securities and Exchange Commission and with the requirements of Rule G-32 of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board.

SECTION 5: The Mayor, the City Administrator, the Finance Director, the City Clerk, and other officers and representatives of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take such other action as may be necessary to carry out the competitive public sale of the Bonds and the refunding of the Refunded Bonds.

SECTION 6: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption by the Board of Aldermen.
