City Attorney Jim Cook read **Bill No. B18-12** for its first reading by title only

- Alderman Totton moved to accept first reading of Bill No. B18-12 bringing it back for a second reading by title only

 - Ocity Administrator Hunt reviewed the changes drafted to Section 115: Officers and Employees; an exhibit was provided showing a 10 mile, 20 mile, and 30 mile radius from City Hall so the Board of Aldermen are able to make a decision regarding the guidelines to be established
 - Alderman Bamman felt that response time with a 30 mile radius was too far and a 10 mile radius is too close; questioned if the Chief of Police could run code if an emergency was occurring; consensus of the Board was to set the requirements so that the discussed positions would be required to live within 20 miles of City Hall

ITEM XVIII: MAYOR REPORT

- Mayor Mike Todd
 - Sni-A-Bar Traffic Circle-concerns about upkeep of property which does not belong to the City but needs to be managed
 - Mr. Arroyo shared that it belonged to the Homeowners Association which no longer exists; staff will revisit the area to find options to keep it maintained
 - Alderman Totton suggested taking over the maintenance of the property; City Attorney Cook suggested the current owners of the subdivision would have a claim to the piece of property and suggested preparing a quick claim deed which will eliminate the chain of title; Mr. Murphy believes the 4 houses surrounding the traffic circle are the only owners to the former HOA; Mr. Hunt thought to move forward the owners could be contacted and have a discussion about the future of the area
 - Creekside Village Alleyways
 - City Attorney Cook said the City does not own the alleys and the chain of title stops when the property was foreclosed; there is no right of way; City needs to determine if they want to take on the responsibilities of the alley and make the roadways City roads instead of their current classification of shared private drive
 - City would have lots of expenses if roads were taken over; staff would be opposed due to the current transportation systems which need to be taken care of; roads were never constructed to be anything other than private drives; multiple roads are currently waiting on the overlay program
 - Alderman Coleman said that trash trucks are driving down the alleys causing some of the repair issues; Mr. Murphy shared that City can not enforce the trash collection in that area as it is not City property; 28 of the houses are rental homes and therefore a large majority of the HOA is owned by the same person; the only code which can be enforced is nuisance of property
 - Alderman Coleman has spoken with residents but doesn't see the City taking over the streets; Aldermen Headley asked if a Neighborhood Improvement District could be looked at to assess on property tax; City Administrator Hunt said a vote of the property owners would be needed but with the majority stakeholder out of state this may hinder the votes;








































































Preferred Land Use Plan

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 115: OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES - SECTION 115.030, SECTION 115.100, AND SECTION 115.200 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI

WHEREAS, the positions of City Administrator, City Clerk, and Chief of Police are positions of authority within the City of Grain Valley, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, residency requirements limit the pool of qualified candidates applying for these positions as they become vacant;

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri have determined that it is in the best interest of the City to amend the residency requirements for the City Administrator, City Clerk and Chief of Police.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

SECTION 1: Sections 115.030, 115.100, and 115.200, of Chapter 115 are amended to read as follows:

SECTION: 115.030: OFFICERS TO BE VOTERS AND RESIDENTS – EXCEPTIONS, APPOINTED OFFICERS

All officers elected to offices or appointed to fill a vacancy in any elective office under the City Government shall be voters under the laws and Constitution of this State and the ordinances of the City except that appointed officers need not be voters of the City. No person shall be elected or appointed to any office who shall at the time be in arrears for any unpaid City taxes, or forfeiture or defalcation in office. 

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 220: FIREWORKS – SECTION 220.030, SECTION 220.060 AND SECTION 220.090 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen are committed to the public's enjoyment of regulated fireworks displays during the Independence Day season;

WHEREAS, it is beneficial to have set dates established for the annual sale and discharge of fireworks;

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri have determined that it is in the best interest of the City to amend the fireworks regulations for the City.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

SECTION 1: Sections 220.030, 220.060 and 220.090, of Chapter 220 are amended to read as follows:

SECTION: 220.030: PERIOD OF SALE LIMITED

The period during which sale of fireworks is lawful by licensed fireworks vendors shall extend from seven (7) days prior to July fourth (4th) and shall end at 11:00 P.M. on July fourth (4th) each year.

SECTION: 220.060: SIGNS REQUIRED

Four (4) signs, red in color and a minimum of two (2) feet by four (4) feet in size, with white lettering, bearing the words "No smoking allowed nor discharging fireworks within one hundred (100) feet of stand" shall be displayed. Six (6) temporary off-site signs, balloons, or animations located on commercial or industrial zoned property are permitted. Signs are limited to 4 feet x 8 feet in size except that signs along I-70 may be 8 feet x 50 feet. Four (4) additional on-site signs are permitted. One (1) American flag shall be displayed on the site that is used for the sales of fireworks. A minimum of four (4) signs bearing the lawful discharge dates shall be posted in each sale tent and all purchasers of fireworks shall be given a copy of the lawful discharge dates to take home at the time of purchase. Signs are permitted only during the period that the sale of fireworks is permitted and they must be removed by July fifth (5th). Sign permits are not required for the above signs.

SECTION 220.090: DISCHARGE LAWFUL - WHEN

A. The discharge, detonation or shooting of fireworks shall only be permitted between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 11:00 P.M. on the first (1st) Saturday of July each year as well as the third (3rd) and fourth (4th) of July each year. In years which the third (3rd) or fourth (4th) of July falls on a Saturday, the second (2nd) of July will also be allowed.

CHAPTER 220: FIREWORKS

Article I: Generally

Section 220.030 Period of Sale Limited. [Code 1985, §66.030; CC 1990 §7-68; Ord. No. 1033 §1, 6-27-1996]

The period during which sale of fireworks is lawful by licensed fireworks vendors shall extend from seven (7) days prior to July fourth (4th) and shall end at 11:00 P.M. on July fifth fourth (5th4th) each year.

Section 220.060 Signs Required. [Code 1985, §66.080; CC 1990 §7-72; Ord. No. 802 §7-72, 6-22-1992; Ord. No. 990 §3, 11-27-1995]

Four (4) signs, red in color and a minimum of two (2) feet by four (4) feet in size, with white lettering, bearing the words "No smoking allowed nor discharging fireworks within one hundred (100) feet of stand" shall be displayed. Six (6) temporary off-site signs, balloons, or animations located on commercial or industrial zoned property are permitted. Signs are limited to 4 feet x 8 feet in size except that signs along I-70 may be 8 feet x 50 feet. Four (4) additional on-site signs are permitted. One (1) American flag shall be displayed on the site that is used for the sales of fireworks. A minimum of four (4) signs bearing the lawful discharge dates shall be posted in each sale tent and all purchasers of fireworks shall be given a copy of the lawful discharge dates to take home at the time of purchase. Section 220.090 Discharge Lawful — **When.** [Code 1985, §66.160; CC 1990 §7-75; Ord. No. 533, 6-23-1986; Ord. No. 990 §4, 11-27-1995; Ord. No. 1033 §4, 6-27-1996; Ord. No. 2299 §1, 6-10-2013]

A. The discharge, detonation or shooting of fireworks shall only be permitted between the hours of 1:00 P.M. and 11:00 P.M. on the third (3rd) of July and between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 11:00 P.M. on the first (1st) Saturday of July each year as well as the third (3rd) and fourth (4th) and fifth (5th) of July each year. In years which the third (3rd) or fourth (4th) of July falls on a Saturday, the second (2nd) of July will also be allowed.

B. The explosion of fireworks at any other times is unlawful, except by special permit of the Board of Aldermen.

PURPOSE	To allow the development of a convenience (mini) storage facility and two future pad sites	
BACKGROUND	This zoning change is the first step in allowing the development of a convenience (mini) storage facility on the majority of the land as well as two future pad sites where single-family homes currently exist. These properties are approximately 4.1+/- acres in size and include eight parcels. Three of the parcels are currently undeveloped. Three are used for Charley's Roadhouse and two are used as single-family dwellings. Mr. Risinger approached staff with a proposal to develop the area into convenience storage. Staff let Mr. Risinger know that the current zoning wouldn't allow for that use.	

SPECIAL NOTES	According to our zoning code, convenience storage is only allowed by conditional use permit and can only be approved for parcels with M-1 light industrial or C-3 highway commercial zoned districts. Staff told Mr. Risinger that a change to M-1 would not be supported but that the area he was looking at is shown as commercial in the future land use plan. This would be the first step in the process to develop the land for convenience storage. There was a public hearing held at the July Planning & Zoning Commission and there will now be a public hearing and ordinance at the Board of Aldermen level to establish zoning. If the zoning change is approved, Mr. Risinger can then apply for a conditional use permit which will require a public hearing at a P&Z meeting as well as a public hearing and ordinance at the BOA level. Conditions addressing, lighting, landscaping and building materials can be added at that time to minimize negative effects on surrounding
ANALYSIS	Staff has looked at this area as future commercial with its location near the intersection of Main Street and SW Eagles Parkway as well as being across from Old Towne Marketplace. Specific uses were not something that was outlined in the Comprehensive Plan. The long-term plan for the applicant is to establish the zoning as C-3 and then apply for a conditional use permit for convenience storage that will take place in three phases with the removal of
	Charley's Roadhouse coming in the third phase. The two parcels which currently have single-family homes on them are not planned to be included in the convenience storage but will be available for individual commercial development. The two lots are similar in size to the old Red Cross Pharmacy lot. Changing the zoning of the lots used for Charley's Roadhouse will not affect any of the non-conformance issues that currently exist because bars are not an allowable use in C-3 districts.







































































Preferred Land Use Plan


