- Butch Beeman with Troutt, Beeman & Company provided a copy of the audit findings for 2018 to each member of the Board; Mr. Beeman shared appreciation for Cathy, Mallory, and the whole finance department for their assistance with the audit; The auditors opinion is the city’s financial statements received the highest level for an audit
- Alderman West questioned the supplement and wants to know the adjustments to the journal entries since she had not seen these in the past; Beeman said auditors are required to show all adjustments agreed to by management and not uncommon for auditors to suggest these types of changes
- Alderman West expected operating funds for water vs. sewer to be similar; Beeman said he doesn’t know without looking into the reports; City Administrator Hunt will look into that and get back to Alderman West; explained there is a water purchase expense that doesn’t happen in sewer; sewer has treatment payments, but at much lower rate than what water costs

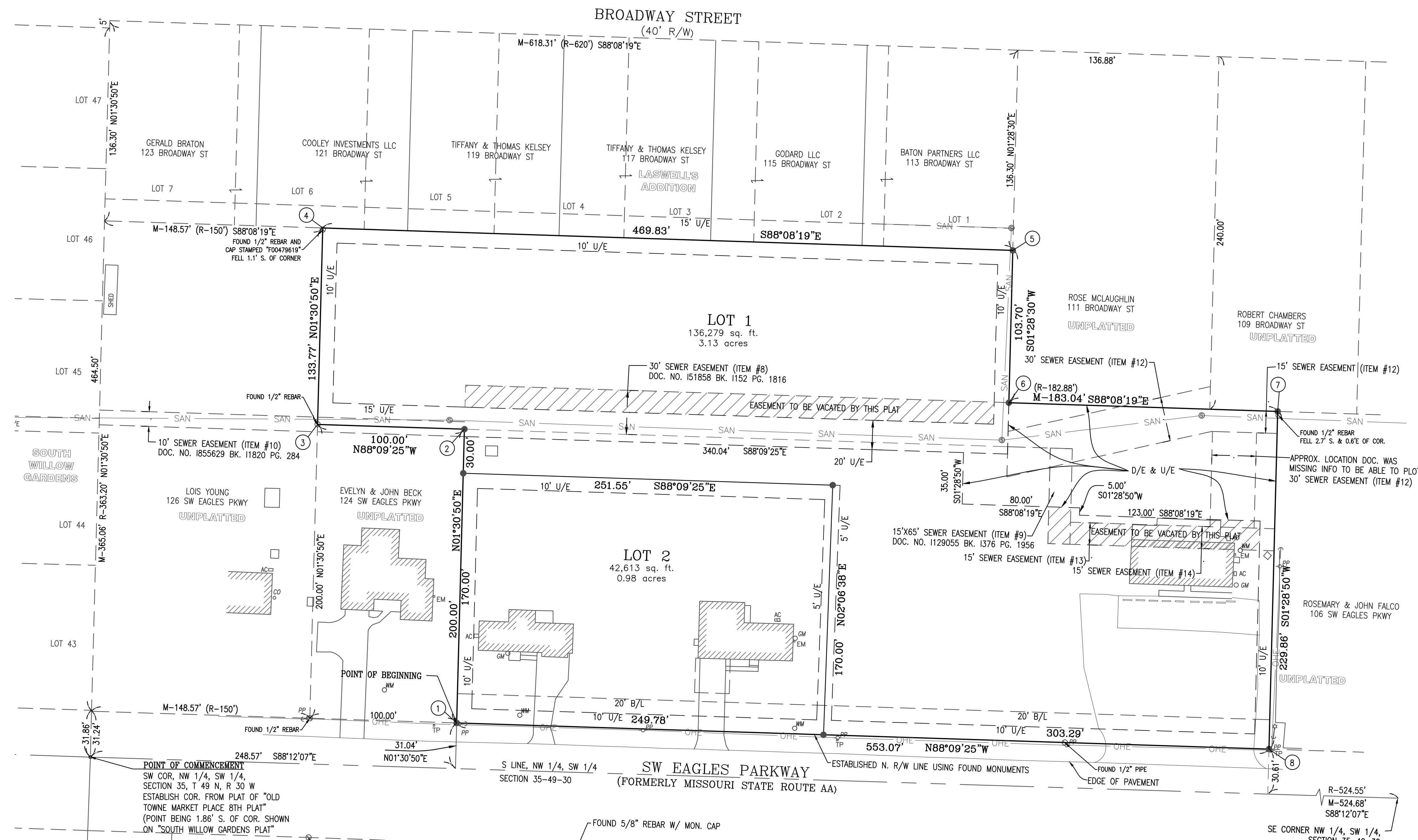

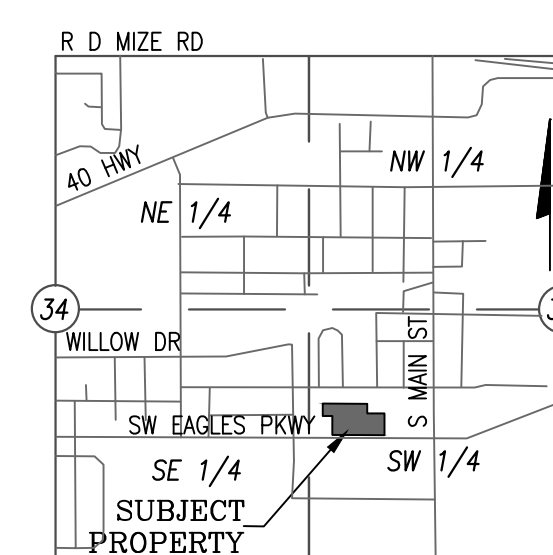

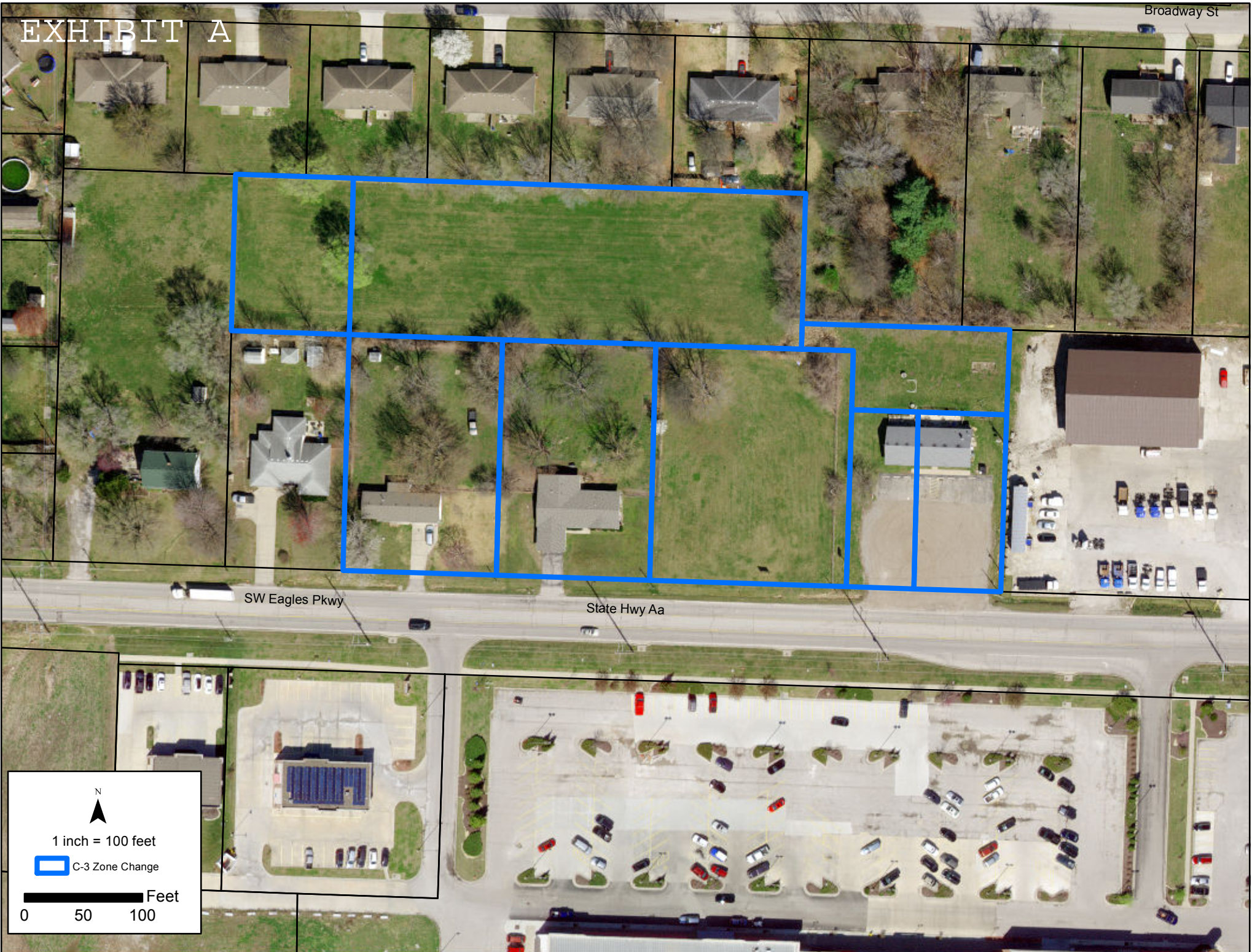
LOCATION MAP
