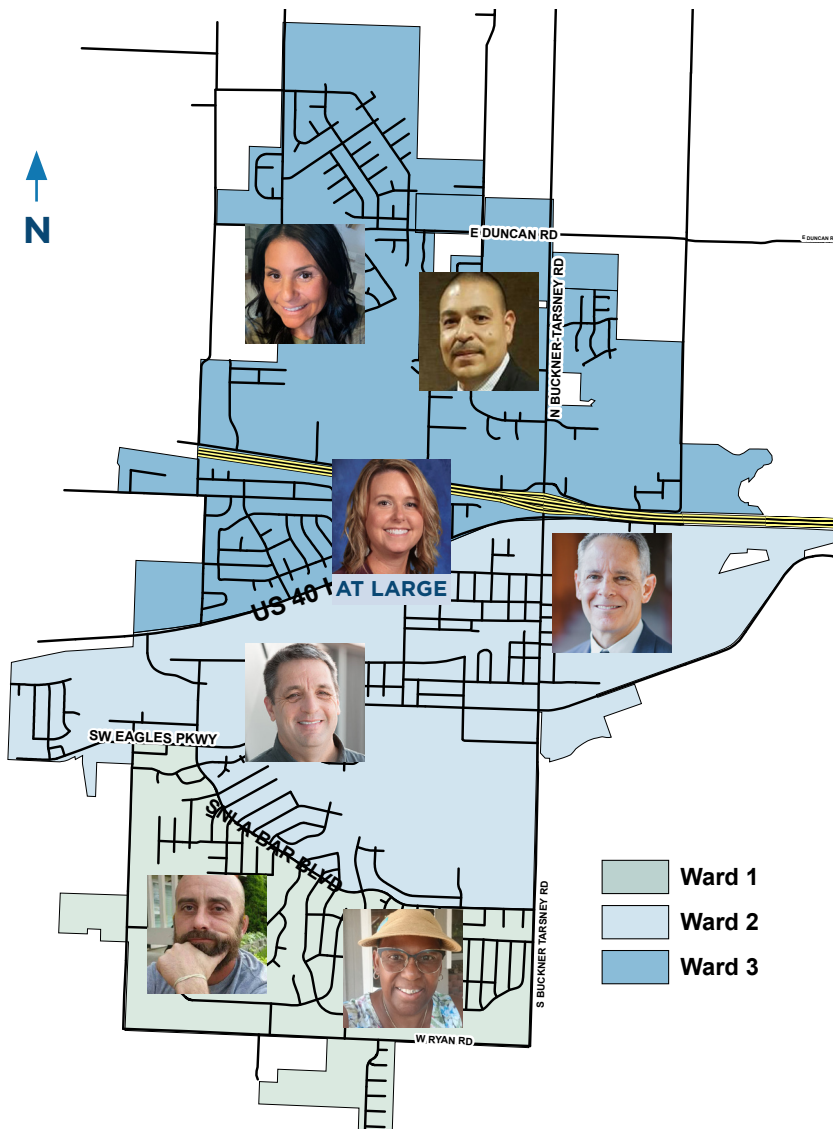


MEET THE GRAIN VALLEY STUDY GROUP



The Grain Valley police station study group is identifying goals, priorities and design options for building a new police station for our community.

- ▶ Seven community members who either reside, own businesses or work within the three wards of Grain Valley are committing three months of their personal time to understand the facility needs of the Grain Valley Police Department.
- ▶ The study group has toured other metropolitan police stations and learned about national standards and law enforcement requirements to help ensure Grain Valley has a new station that meets future community growth and public safety needs.
- ▶ The study group is focused on making recommendations to city officials that reflect features that meet the needs of the police force, community values and are fiscally responsible.



Study Group Charter

The Grain Valley Police Station Study Group will collectively evaluate the needs and scope for a new police station. Speaking with one voice, the group will make a justifiable recommendation to the City of Grain Valley that reflects the values of the community, ensures the long-term needs of the police department are met, and is financially sound. In developing its recommendation, the group will strive to represent all community perspectives and anticipate the concerns and questions of the community.

Study Group Goals

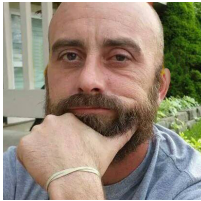
- ▶ Study group recommendations will be financially sound and strive for the most bang for the buck to benefit the community

Lance has been an involved member of the community for nearly 30 years and is proud to continue working toward the professional development of the city.

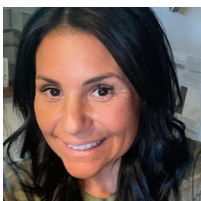


Wayne Geiger
